OVERVIEW

In this dynamic and interactive course, participants learn ways to communicate Permaculture principles and strategies to a wide variety of audiences and educational settings. As a class we co-create a *safe setting for active* learning, inspiring change and learning diverse teaching techniques for any subject. By preparing for and co-teaching multiple presentations, participants learn effective teaching strategies that builds confidence via practice and peer coaching.

Jude demonstrates various teaching modalities including lecture, storytelling, class discussions, interactive experiential activities, visual aids and hands-on skills.

Everyone's unique skills and experiences are respected. A core part of Jude's work is inspiring and training the next generations of Permaculture advocates. To this end, we cultivates networking for future connections and continued support.

As in the Permaculture Design Course, in this Teacher Training we focus on finding *practical ways* to share information, an essential skill in the world today. Course graduates could possibly teach to many audiences; from a one hour class to weekend workshops to PDC's. Jude is an advocate for teaching the Mollisonian Standard Permaculture Design Course curriculum. She believes all teachings need to speak directly to local conditions and the specific skills of the presenters' team. For that reason, each class is as unique as the individuals in it.

Jude has taught this PTT course over thirty times, and is continually adjusting her teaching approach to incorporate individual needs, feedback and new pedogeological research.

This is a Certificate Course offered by an Instructor of the Permaculture Institute of North America and is based on the Advanced Permaculture Course in Teaching Jude attended with Max Lindegger and Lea Harrison in 1990.

IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR YOU?

The course is a great fit for Permaculture Design Course graduates of all skill levels, as well as professional teachers who want to expand and fine-tune their Permaculture knowledge. We welcome community activists,

designers, homesteaders and anyone who wishes to share the knowledge of systems thinking and integrated inter-dependent living strategies.

WHAT WILL YOU GAIN FROM THE ADVANCED TEACHER TRAINING?

1) Increased knowledge of learning theories and curriculum planning

- Explore how adults learn.
- Assess how your personal learning styles and assets shape your teaching style.
- Improve course outcomes by defining learning objectives and planning efficiently.
- Match your curriculum to your specific teaching context:
 - Settings may range from bioregional to global.
 - Time frames may range from a one hour or one day class, to a weekend workshop or 90+ hour PDC.
- Infuse your teaching with the Permaculture principles.
 - o Include the relevancy of practical design application.
- Consider what you need to know about PDC certification and accreditation.

2) Skill-building through experiential learning

- Experience diverse learning activities that reflect the educational paradigm shift:
 - From passive to active learning
 - Visual, auditory, kinesthetic learning, and the eight intelligences
 - Transformational learning
 - Loop learning: the inter-connection of all topics in any teaching situation.
- Apply documentation skills through note taking and journaling.
- Practice the art of facilitation, including deep listening, timeliness, and discussion of other challenges facilitators experience.
- Hone your adaptability, timing, and delivery as a presenter, through supportive peer critiques and instructor feedback.
- ♦ Apply your new knowledge about learning theories by creating *three teaching modules* and a *final group project to be presented to the public*.

3) Professional networking

- Meet one-on-one with instructor(s) to discuss your personal goals.
- Receive guidance on professional development and continuing education.
 - For example, hear about opportunities to work with the Permaculture Institute of North America (PINA) as a Diploma Candidate.
- Build positive bonds and develop networking opportunities with like-minded people who embrace the strategies and methodologies of Permaculture Design.
- Discover potential future collaborations through group work with colleagues.
- Acquire a skill-building toolkits: digital handbook and reader containing:
 - Samples of experiential learning activities, power points, articles, and references for topics covered in the teaching curriculum
 - Examples of Permaculture course and workshop curriculums
 - o Resources for teaching Permaculture in many scenarios.

JUDE'S TEACHING PHILOSOPHY

- Think strategies, not recipes. As Bill Mollison frequently said, "What we are teaching you is not How to do it, but how to Think about doing it."
- Ask important questions
 - O What are your intentions and goals as an educator?
 - o How does teaching serve you? And others?

- ≪ Keep participants engaged by continually shifting the conventional paradigm of teaching.
